From the Pastor's Desk

Since I have arrived, there have been many and various items that need repair or maintenance. I have tried to address these items as best as I can. Some of these are large and complex, like our steps, sound system, heating and cooling system, fire sprinkler system, etc. These need trained professionals who specialize in these areas. As everyone knows, this takes money. That is why we recently ran our capital campaign. Half of the money from our campaign went towards our maintenance needs. Unfortunately, since the beginning of the campaign, the list of these needs continues to grow.

There are also many smaller items that our skilled maintenance staff can fix and maintain. But they are stretched very thin. In response to this, I have asked certain people in the parish to help with these smaller items.

For example, you may have noticed that the trees that were dying in the front of the church were taken down and replaced. Or, you may have observed that the northwest entrance of the church was redone. If you look down when you are walking in the atrium, you may have noticed that the cracked tiles and deteriorating grout was fixed. The chipped corners on the entrance of the church were repaired. The inside of the church isn't the only place that needs maintenance. Around the grounds weeds and trees have been pulled. In the rectory, a cabinet was built and curtains replaced and donated. Various items in around the school were also addressed. I could go on and on with the many projects that have been done around the parish.

The amazing thing is that just a few parishioners did all of this work. What makes this even more special is that these parishioners donated the materials as well as their time and talents. All of this greatly helps our parish budget. More importantly, it reveals a love and commitment to our parish. Imagine what could be done around here if more people volunteered their time and talent and treasure for the upkeep of our parish.

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel

On Monday July 16th, the Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.

Some of you may have seen people wearing two brown pieces of cloth attached with a string. This is called the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. In statues or pictures of Mary under this title she is holding Jesus in one arm and in the other she is holding out a Brown Scapular.

She is offering it to us but she first offered it to St. Simon Stock who prayed for her help for his struggling Carmelite order. He was said to have composed the prayer *Flos Carmeli* (*Flower of*

Carmel) as a way of imploring Mary's intercession.

*O beautiful Flower of Carmel, most fruitful Vine,
Splendor of Heaven, holy and singular,
who brought forth the Son of God,
still ever remaining a Pure Virgin,
assist me in this necessity...*

Mary appeared to him and said, "*Take, beloved son, this scapular of the order as a badge of my confraternity and for you and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant.*"

Devotion to the Brown Scapular has grown over the years and is worn by more than those who belong to the Carmelite order. But those who are invested in the Brown Scapular share in the graces of the Carmelite order and the promises of Mary.

The other day my Brown Scapular broke and I was not able to get to a religious store to buy another one. The thought came to me that I should check the "religious goods" section in the atrium. You know, the tables in the corner near the library where you always see a group of kids gathered. Well, the other day, I was one of those kids. I was looking for a scapular. Lo and behold, I found one and put it around my neck.

It is not a superstitious practice or a magical item. It is a sacramental that obtains grace for the wearer and reminds them of the promises they made to pray and live virtuous Christian life. A scapular is supposed to be made of wool, which comes from a sheep or lamb. Jesus is the Lamb of God. St. Paul says, "Put on the Lord Jesus and make no provision for the flesh." (Rm. 13:14). When I put on my scapular I am reminding myself of these words. The wool scapular also helps to remind us that we are sheep of the Good Shepherd's flock. When we place it on our shoulders I am reminded of Jesus, Who searches for His lost sheep and when He finds them, places them gently on His shoulders and carries them home.

I would be happy to invest anyone who wants to wear the Brown Scapular of Mt. Carmel. While I can't guarantee that you will find one at the "religious tables" in the atrium, I can guarantee that it will help open you to receive Mary's promise of God's grace.

Facility Update: Church West Stair Project: The treads for the west stairs have been reset. They are now very even with the top of the plaza, which is a *huge* improvement. The vertical sides for both buttresses have been rebuilt and reinforced, and the granite stones are in place. Next up: the granite stone caps for the buttresses. When the buttresses are complete, the crew will begin work on the south stair from the plaza. The sidewalk leading to the south stair will be closed while under construction. The north stair to the plaza will remain open.
School Fire Protection Project: The **Fire Sprinkler System** pipe work for the lower level of the school is complete and ready to be tested. The second level (main level) of the school is coming along very well. The **Fire Alarm Upgrade** crew were on site to complete the installation of electrical boxes and devices. After all the boxes are installed, they will begin pulling cable to each device.

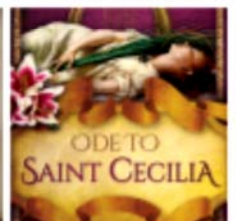
