# **PENTECOST SUNDAY**



## From the Pastor's Desk

Today the Easter season concludes with Pentecost Sunday, commemorating that day when the Father and the Son poured out the Holy Spirit in a special way on the Apostles and they took up the mission of proclaiming the Gospel throughout the whole world.

In today's First reading we hear about wind and fire filling the room where the Apostles were gathered. Wind and fire are powerful forces in the world. They can be destructive as well as regenerating. A forest fire can cause great destruction. It can be contained with some effort but add a powerful wind and its extremely difficult to contain and hundreds of thousands of acres can be destroyed. But with this destruction comes new life. Shortly after a forest fire, new life begins to grow.

God sent the Holy Spirit in the form of wind and fire. This fire came down on the Apostles while they were in the upper room behind locked doors. In other words, the fire was contained. But God also sent a "mighty wind" so that this fire would spread. These images help us to understand how the flame of faith spread in the early Church. It also helps us to understand the regenerating power of this "fire." The fire of the Holy Spirit working through the apostles destroyed the strongholds and structures of the enemies of God and brought about new life in the Spirit.

This "fire" has spread throughout the world and is still burning wherever there are faithful Christians. Bishops wear a miter on their head to symbolize this flame of fire. Through their apostolic ministry they continue to pass on the flame of faith.

All of us have received this flame of faith and are called to spread this fire in our various states in life. One way in which people can do this is in working in the Church. We are very blessed to have a wonderful staff who are filled with the Holy Spirit and on fire for God. Therefore, I am saddened to announce that two members of our staff will be retiring at the end of the May.

Marge Powers has generously served as our parish Business Administrator for just over 6 years. She has brought a lot of gifts to this job and has poured her heart and soul into serving the parish. # PENTECOST

“Many have wished that Our Blessed Lord had remained on earth, that we might have heard His voice, seen His compassionate eyes, and brought our children to be blessed by His hands. But He said ‘I can say truly that it is better for you I should go away; He who is to befriend you will not come to you unless I do go, but if only I make my way there, I will send Him to you. If our Lord remained on earth, He would have



been only a symbol to be copied – not a life to be lived. By returning to his heavenly Father, He could then send both from the Father and Himself the Holy Spirit that would make Him live on earth in His new Body, which is the Church. The human body is made up of millions of cells, and yet is one because vivified by one soul, presided over by a visible head, and governed by an invisible mind. So on Pentecost, the Apostles, who were like the cells of a body, became Christ’s Mystical Body, because vivified by His Holy Spirit, governed by one visible head, Peter, and presided over by one invisible head, Christ in heaven. Our glorious Church is not an organization, but an organism. As our Lord once thought, governed, and sanctified through a human body, which He took from the womb of His blessed Mother, so now he teaches, governs, and sanctifies through His Mystical Body, the Church, which He took from the womb of humanity overshadowed by His Holy Spirit.” – Archbishop Fulton Sheen (*The Fifteen Mysteries*)
