From the Pastor's Desk

The Martyrs

There is an old saying that the blood of the martyrs are the seeds of faith. To be a martyr means to be a witness. The Martyrs shed their blood in witness to their faith in Jesus and His Catholic Church. This week the Church celebrates some of these martyrs.

All martyrs seem to have a desire to offer their life as the ultimate testimony of their faith. On his way to Rome to be martyred, St. Ignatius writes this letter to the Romans:

"I write to the Churches, and impress on them all, that I willingly die for God, unless you hinder me - Allow me to become food for the wild beasts, through which I will be granted life with God. I am the wheat of God, and let me be ground by the teeth of the wild beasts, that I may be found the pure bread of Christ."

Although born almost 1600 years later than St. Ignatius of

Antioch, St. Isaac Jogues was no different in his zeal for being a martyr. He was captured and tortured by Native Americans. The fingers that he used to hold the Sacred Host were cut off so that he needed to return to France for a dispensation to celebrate Mass without these fingers. He was granted the dispensation and returned to the people whom he loved and shortly after his return, he was martyred.

Let us pray for the same faith and zeal to be witnesses of our faith.

Stewardship

"As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Peter 4:10).

What identifies a steward?

"Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. But being a Christian steward means more. As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord.

We are also obliged to be stewards of the Church—collaborators and cooperators in continuing the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, which is the Church's essential mission. This mission—proclaiming and teaching, serving and sanctifying—is our task. It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the Church. All members of the Church have their own roles to play in carrying out its mission:

- Parents, who nurture their children in the light of faith;
- Parishioners, who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community;
- All Catholics, who give generous support—time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocesan programs and to the universal Church."

(from A Summary of the U.S. Bishops' Pastoral Letter on Stewardship)

Today's bulletin offers varied ways for each of us to become more active stewards of the Church.

Have you considered taking a morning off from your routine and exploring more of what you can do here at St. Charles Borromeo?

Here is one illustration of how to spend such morning. to consider, Thursday, October 25th:

6:30 – 7:30 AM – Start with:

Men: Lectio Divina in Doran Hall – an opportunity for all men to come together and grow in faith

All: Adoration – quiet prayer before our Lord in the Adoration Chapel is a peaceful beginning to any day

7:30 AM – Move into the Church for Morning Prayer (*don't know how?* sit in a pew next to someone who does and ask if you can follow along – they will be happy to help you!) *"The hymns and litanies of the Liturgy of the Hours integrate the prayer of the psalms into the age of the Church, expressing the symbolism of the time of day, the liturgical season, or the feast being celebrated. Moreover, the reading from the Word of God at each Hour (with the subsequent responses or troparia) and readings from the Fathers and spiritual masters at certain Hours, reveal more deeply the meaning of the mystery being celebrated, assist in understanding the psalms, and prepare for silent prayer."* (CCC 1177)

8:00 AM – Mass

8:45 AM – Immediately after Mass, stay for brunch in Doran Hall to learn more about the grace and beauty of the Funeral Apostolate

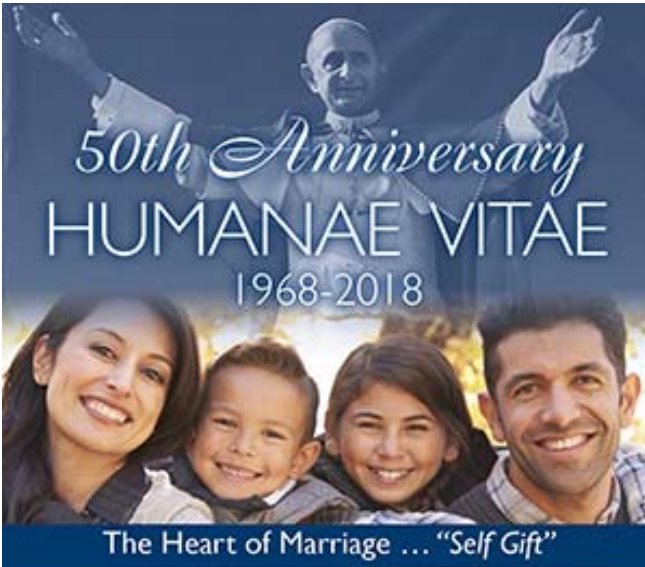
